Parent Take-Home Sheet

WHAT WE LEARNED TODAY

Today your child heard the story of David and Goliath from 1 Samuel 17. We talked about how David was just a young shepherd boy, but he trusted God to give him victory over a giant that terrified an entire army. The big idea: God uses ordinary people to do extraordinary things when they trust Him.

THIS WEEK'S MEMORY VERSE

"The Lord who rescued me from the paw of the lion and the paw of the bear will rescue me from the hand of this Philistine." (1 Samuel 17:37)

TALK ABOUT IT AT HOME

- Ask your child to tell you the story. What happened first? What did David say to Goliath?
- Talk about giants: What feels really big or scary in your life right now? (It could be a test, a friendship problem, moving to a new place, or worries about the future.)
- David practiced with his sling while protecting his sheep. What are ways we can practice trusting God in small things so we are ready for the big things?
- Pray together: Thank God for being bigger than any problem you face. Ask Him for courage and faith.

DO TOGETHER THIS WEEK

- Read 1 Samuel 17 together as a family (or a children's Bible version for younger kids).
- Practice the memory verse each day. Try saying it while tossing a ball back and forth.
- Go on a nature walk and find five smooth stones. Talk about why David chose them.
- Color the David and Goliath coloring page together.
